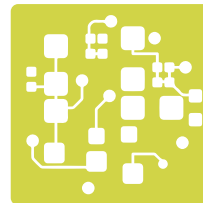

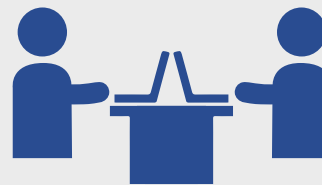

## HIGH IMPACT PRACTICES

FY24 was the first full year that the NSSE High-Impact Practices were available as a taggable feature in the toolkit. Since their launch, 38 schools have used the feature and 3,332 responses were collected. Students reported the highest scores for the Research with Faculty HIP, with an average score of 4.5, followed by the Learning Community HIP with an average score of 4.3, the Culminating Senior Experience HIP with a score of 4.2, and the Service Learning HIP with an average score of 4.1. No schools have tagged their surveys with the Internship/Field Experience or Study Abroad HIPs in the toolkit yet. Learn more about this valuable feature by [reading this resource](#).
